

GIUK Cookie Policy

Our Cookie Policy explains the use cookies on our website, and should be read in association with the GIUK Privacy Notice.

Use of cookies. Parts of our Website use or may use cookies such as the contact form. A cookie is a small text file that is sent to your computer or other device which can be accessed over the Internet. Each time you return to the Website, your browser retrieves and sends the relevant cookie(s) to the Website's server. Cookies may retrieve personal data about you and do not corrupt or damage your Device or files. These transient cookies are deleted when you close your browser. Data is not retained after closing your internet browser, except where you are given the option of having such data saved for future visits. Apart from cookies that are necessary for website functionality, we may use cookies to collect anonymous information on how visitors use our Website so as to recognise and count the number of visitors, how the site is used and which pages are most used. Information obtained can then be used to improve our Website, but may also be used in order to ensure any advertising on the Website or elsewhere is appropriately targeted. When you visit our Website the servers may record your IP address together with the date, time and duration of your visit for statistical purposes.

Acceptance of cookies. By using this Website after accepting the cookie notice that appears when you first visit the Website, or by browsing our Website, after having been presented with this cookie notice, you agree to the placement of cookies on your Device in accordance with the terms of this Policy. You are not obliged to accept a cookie that we send to you, and you have the ability to accept, decline or delete cookies by modifying the settings in your browser. However, some cookies are necessary for the correct use of our Website so you may not be able to use all the features on our Website if cookies are disabled.

How long cookies are stored. Cookies are stored on your Device for a maximum of two years from the date of installation or subsequent update.

How to manage cookies. If you do not wish to receive cookies or do not want to be notified of when they are placed, you may set your web browser to do so, if your browser permits it.

Changes to the Cookie Policy. When we change our Cookie Policy, we will publish the updated policy on our Website.
